Pour water in dishes of your choice and place your items in the water. Add a piece of string with half of it in the water and half out. Leave the dishes outside overnight or place in the freezer. Recycle large boxes and decorate with crayons, paint, or tissue paper and glue. No boxes in the house? Help your child draw the outline of a tree with the black marker on the blue construction paper. Flip your paper bowl upside down and cut a small semi-circle from the lid of the bowl upwards to create a small cave. With the bowl still turned upside down, paint the exterior gray or brown.
